COVID Update

This week the Department of Education lifted many restrictions in our school and it is wonderful to be able to invite our parents and carers back on site. We do remind everyone that we are still expected to follow COVID safe practices, including social distancing between adults of 1.5m. Some level of restrictions and guidelines will remain in place for schools for some time and we remind everyone that if visiting our school, you are still expected to sign in. Kindergarten and Year 1 students will be brought to the courtyard each afternoon and parents may pick them up from here at 2:55pm or at either of the gates if this is preferred. If you are a parent helper in the classroom, please visit the front office and fill out the necessary paperwork prior to entering the classroom. It is still important that we all remain vigilant in implementing COVIDsafe practices in our schools and workplaces and we thank you for your ongoing support and patience.

Parent Teacher Interviews

Year 6-7 High School Expression of Interest Forms for 2022

Every Year 6 student would have received an Expression of Interest form for parents to add family details and check the local high school is correct. This is just an expression of interest required from the Department of Education and an opportunity to apply for any out of area requests. You DO NOT need to know exactly where your child will be attending High School, it is just an expression of interest and an indication as to how many students may be attending each school.

If you have any questions please ask your child's teacher or phone the front office. **Please ensure that these forms are returned by March 19**. Thank you to all of the families who have already completed these forms and returned them to school.

Rumbalara WOW (Wiping Out Waste)

On Wednesday, 10 March a team from Rumbalara Environmental Centre visited our school to undertake a waste audit as part of the WOW initiative. We collected all our waste from the previous day and with a dedicated team in the morning session sorted, grouped and weighed the contents. All the students in the school were amazed when we went through the data and did the Maths! In the afternoon some of our older members of the PBL Kids Team began an action plan to wipe out the waste. Lisa from Rumbalara said that we were the best team that she had worked with. I congratulate the students on giving their Personal Best. We look forward to implementing some new strategies to reduce waste at our school.

NAPLAN Year 3 and 5 students

All students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language and numeracy in May this year. The assessment provides parents and carers with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process and it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performances. Please see information attached in this newsletter in regard to this assessment and please talk to your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.

Scripture and Ethics

Yesterday, Scripture and Ethics classes began for the year. K- 2 classes are held between 10:15 - 10:55 and 3 - 6 classes will operate from 11:35 - 12:15 each Thursday for the remainder of the year. At our school we have approved providers for Combined Churches and Catholic denominations to operate classes in Scripture. Children have been placed in a group according to last year's arrangements. Students not attending Scripture classes will be provided with supervised alternative, meaningful activities which may include reading, private study and homework. A parent/carer may at any time notify the school in writing that they wish to change their decision. Kindergarten students have been placed according to their enrolment information. In 2021, Special Education in Ethics (SEE) has been provided as an option for parents/carers of Kindergarten students who do not wish for their children to attend Scripture classes. Ms Tisa, a trained teacher of Primary Ethics, the Department of Education's authorised provider of SEE, has volunteered to take a Kindergarten class in Ethics at Kariong PS this year. To extend the Ethics program beyond the Kindergarten class, volunteers are needed with training and support provided by Primary Ethics. Online Enrolment

We are excited to announce the roll out of the new Online Enrolment System. The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens.
- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from our front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Further information about online enrolment can be found on our school website under the 'Enrolment' tab. If you require further information, please call Kariong Public School on 024340 1885.

Online Payments

It is very easy for parents to make online payments to the school via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa, MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner; these details are not passed back to the school. The DoE preferred method for all money coming into the school is the Payment On-Line facility (POP) through the school's website: Kariong-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au.

Item categories

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' to cover items not covered in the previous headings, 'Other' can be used to make a complete payment of a school Statement of Account.

When you access the \$ Make a payment you must enter:

- the student's name
- date of birth

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Helpful Hints

- If a POP payment is made before 6pm, your payment will be processed on the next day's school statement.
- If it is made after 6pm, the school will be notified two days later.
- Please ensure that on your child's permission note, you fill in the section for POP which will require the receipt number.
- At the bottom of every note that requires payment, there is a section for cash, cheque, and Payment On Line, for your convenience.
- Please do not make payments for uniforms on this site. The Uniform Shop is privately run and their website for ordering is: gtschool.com.au.

REMINDER ABOUT MONEY COLLECTING PROCEDURES:

All cash money sent to the school is to be brought to the Administration Office and placed into the letterbox slot that is on the front wall near the counter. This will allow payments to be placed securely, even when the office is not open. Please do not leave money on the counter. We ask that the envelope be marked with your child's name, class and what the payment is for, to allow the payment to be processed. The office staff will administer all money and a receipt will be issued to the family, which will go to the student's class teacher to send home. This

procedure ensures better handling of all monies and reduces disruption to teachers and students. We provide a variety of ways to make payments within the school, to make it easier for families and alleviate some students bringing large amounts of money to school. EFTPOS payments may be processed at the Administration Office between hours 8.30am – 3.00pm. We no longer are permitted to take EFTPOS over the phone. For any enquiries regarding the online payment process, please contact Kariong School Administration Office.



People Bouncing Back

If you are resilient you will be able to cope reasonably well with difficult situations and things that go wrong and then 'bounce back'. Throughout life, children will need skills and attitudes to help them to bounce back. They will encounter everyday challenges such as making mistakes, falling out with a friend, moving house or school and losing in a sports competition.

Many will also face challenges such as adapting to family break ups, a step-family, the illness or death of a family member, or being bullied. People bouncing back is the Curriculum Personal Development Unit that teaches children the 10 Bounce Back! statements. Students at KPS will be using this acronym throughout the school year to remind them that we can all BOUNCE BACK from difficulties and challenges.

Be kind to yourself!

For younger children, the simpler coping statements in BOUNCE are taught, but 'bouncing back' from a setback, a mistake and bad times is still referred to.

Bad feelings always go away again.

Other people can help you feel better if you talk to them.

Unhelpful thinking makes you feel more upset Think again.

Nobody is perfect - not you and not others.

Concentrate on the things that are still good when things go wrong.

Everybody has unhappy times sometimes, not just you.

Bounce Back! stands for:

Bad times don't last. Things always get better. Stay optimistic.

Other people can help if you talk to them. Get a reality check.

Unhelpful thinking makes you feel more upset. Think again.

Nobody is perfect - not you and not others. **C**oncentrate on the positives (no matter how small) and use laughter.

Everybody experiences sadness, failure, hurt, rejection and setbacks sometimes, not just you. They are a normal part of life. Try not to personalise them.

Blame fairly. How much of what happened was due to you, to others and to bad luck or circumstances?

Accept what can't be changed (but try to change what you can change first).

Catastrophising exaggerates your worries. Don't believe the worst possible picture.

Keep things in perspective. It's only part of your life.

NAPLAN Online – information for parents and carers

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Federal, state and territory education ministers agreed that all schools will gradually transition from the current paper-based NAPLAN to NAPLAN Online in order to provide a better and more precise assessment that is more engaging for students.

State and territory education authorities will determine when their schools move online. The current plan is for all schools to transition to NAPLAN Online by 2022.

One of the main benefits of NAPLAN Online is tailored (or adaptive) testing, in which the test presents questions of higher or lower complexity depending on a student's performance.

Tailored (or adaptive) testing is designed to assess a wider range of student abilities and to measure student achievement more precisely. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions more challenging than usual; they may be taking a more complex test pathway. A student's overall NAPLAN score is based on the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly.

Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

Students are assessed on the same literacy and numeracy curriculum content, regardless of whether they complete the tests online or on paper. Results for both formats can be reported on the same NAPLAN assessment scale.

What can I do to support my child?

On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for and students are not expected to do so.

You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply do their best.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

Ensuring students are familiar with using devices, typing on them and navigating through programs is a part of student learning and a requirement of the Australian Curriculum from the first year at school.

NAPLAN Online is not a test of keyboard skills. There are variations in how fast and well a student can type – just as there are variations in how fast and well a student can write by hand. Year 3 students will complete the writing test on paper.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.
