The Kariong school community is extremely proud of how the students have upheld the school values of 'Respect' and 'Responsibility' while aiming for their 'Personal Best'.

Both students and staff have also enjoyed the experience to be involved in learning beyond the classroom. The Year 4 Great Aussie Bush Camp, Year 2 Rumbalara excursion and Year 6 Antarctic incursion provided an experience for students to be engaged and further enriched in the curriculum.

Gymnastics

Years 2-6 completed their gymnastics sessions for the term and the feedback was very positive from both staff and students. We will continue with this program in 2022 due to the popularity and opportunities this provides for the students in physical education.

Reports

There were some eager, excited students on Wednesday afternoon, ready to share their progress with their parents and carers. The students have had a productive and busy semester in their classrooms and teachers have spent many hours writing reports on each student and their progress in all key learning areas. If you would like to discuss your child's progress with the class teacher, please make an appointment for an agreed convenient time.

PBL Rewards Day

On Wednesday, students enjoyed cashing in some of their points for Lori Rewards Day. Students chose their own rewards this term from a menu which included coming to school in PJs, a visit to Peppermint Park, free play on the oval, computer time, a craft session and a movie with popcorn. From all the happy faces it seemed that it was a very enjoyable day for students. Some decided to keep accumulating points for some exciting choices later in the year. We thank Mrs Priest for all her efforts in coordinating the day so everyone had such a great experience

School Attendance

The school will be focusing on attendance and incorporating this into our PBL sessions as of next term. Many students are well below the expected attendance rate therefore we have come up with some ideas such as rewards for the best attendance per class each week and other incentives to come to school. More information on initiatives will be communicated next term.

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. **Department guidelines state that any child with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free.** In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test. If a student is absent for more than three days without a medical certificate, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and followed up by the school.

NAIDOC Week

In the first week of term, we will be celebrating NAIDOC Week which will include an Indigenous experience on Wednesday 14 July. This incorporates two, one hour workshops for students with learning experiences on artefacts, weaponry, bush survival, boomerang throwing, face painting, Aboriginal song, dance, storytelling and didgeridoo performance. A payment of \$7.50 was due today. The school will still accept payments over the holidays online through the POP system. The newsletter has information on paying through this system if you are unfamiliar with this process.

Wellbeing Sessions

Next term all students are offered the opportunity to attend a 40-minute session on wellbeing. Last year the students enjoyed this immensely and so far, we have a high percentage of students opting into this program. Those students not attending the program will be involved in alternative wellbeing learning experiences during the sessions this program is operating.

Education Week

This year Education Week will run from Monday 26 to Friday 30 July 2021, celebrating the theme 'Lifelong Learners'. At Kariong Public School, we will be celebrating Education Week in a variety

of ways. Special events include Premiers Spelling Bee Final on Monday 26 July, an Open Day at the school on Tuesday 27 July as well as the opportunity for some of our students from Years 4-6 to attend Creative Arts sessions at Kariong Mountains High School on Wednesday 28 July. Further information will be sent home early next term.

Kindergarten 2022

Recently we held our first Open Day with over 60 people attending; a very positive morning and a great introduction to our school. We are currently taking enrolments now for 2022, so get the word out there!

Term 3 School Development Day

On Monday July 12 our Staff Development Day will consist of professional learning on high potential and gifted education, a new science / technology program – Prowise and what quality teaching looks like in the classroom. Students will return to school on Tuesday July 13.

Updated COVID Guidelines for Schools

As of Thursday 24 June, updated departmental guidelines came into effect in our schools. Please ensure that upon entering the school to drop off or pick up your child that you sign in using the Service NSW QR code. Whilst at the school or near the entry and exit points, please maintain physical distancing of 1.5m. Current guidelines state that non-essential school visitors are to be excluded from the school premises. Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

In 2021 all Australian Government schools will be implementing the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD), for school students with a disability.

This important data collection will reflect the support that is already being provided to students and will focus on the steps the school is taking to ensure that all students can access education on the same basis. The data will be used to inform future planning by governments and education authorities and will help us to better support the participation of students with disability in our school and all other NSW public schools.

The data collection will focus on the adjustments that are being made by teachers and schools to support individual students to access and participate in education. Schools will collect information already available in the school about:

- The level of adjustment being provided to support students with disability to participate in their schooling like all other students
- The number of students who receive each level of adjustment
- Where known, the student's type of disability.

The data collection process will have no direct impact on your child and they will not be involved in any testing process.

Reported data will be made available in such a way that the privacy all students is maintained.

If you do not want your child to be counted in the data collection you must complete the attached form and return it to the school before Friday 16 July.

Online Enrolment

We are excited to announce the roll out of the new Online Enrolment System. The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens,
- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from our front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Further information about online enrolment can be found on our school website under the 'Enrolment' tab. If you require further information, please call Kariong Public School on 024340 1885.

Online Payments*

It is very easy for parents to make online payments to the school via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa, MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/ debit card details are captured in a secure manner; these details are not passed back to the school. The DoE preferred method for all money coming into the school is the Payment On-Line facility (POP) through the school's website: Kariong-p.school@det. nsw.edu.au

Item categories

 If a POP payment is made before 6pm, your payment will be processed on the next day's school statement. If it is made after 6pm, the school will be notified two days later.

Please ensure that on your child's permission note, you fill in the section for POP which will require the receipt number.

- At the bottom of every note that requires payment, there is a section for cash, cheque, and Payment On Line, for your convenience.
- Please do not make payments for uniforms on this site. The Uniform Shop is privately run and their website for ordering is: gtschool.com.au.

Helpful Hints

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' to cover items not covered in the previous headings, 'Other' can be used to make a complete payment of a school Statement of Account.

When you access the \$ Make a payment you must enter:

the student's name
date of birth

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

A REMINDER ABOUT ABOUT MONEY COLLECTING PROCEDURES

All cash money sent to the school is to be brought to the Administration Office and placed into the letterbox slot that is on the front wall near the counter. This will allow payments to be placed securely, even when the office is not open.

Please do not leave money on the counter. We ask that the envelope be marked with your child's name, class and what the payment is for, to allow the payment to be processed.

The office staff will administer all money and a receipt will be issued to the family, which will go to the student's class teacher to send home. This procedure ensures better handling of all monies and reduces disruption to teachers and students.

We provide a variety of ways to make payments within the school, to make it easier for families and alleviate some students bringing large amounts of money to school.

EFTPOS payments may be processed at the Administration Office between hours 8.30am - 3.00pm.

We no longer are permitted to take EFTPOS over the phone. For any enquiries regarding the online payment process, please contact Kariong School Administration Office.
