Education Week

Education Week is an annual celebration of NSW public education and the achievements of our schools, students and education system. This year Education Week will run from Monday 26 to Friday 30 July 2021 celebrating the theme Lifelong Learners. We look forward to celebrating our students and their learning here at school during this week. Notes and information will be sent home early next term.

Wellbeing Program Term 3

Next term all students K-6, are invited to participate in a Body & Mind Wellbeing program organised by an experienced external provider, 'Dance Fever Multisport'. Dance Fever Multisport have been teaching physical education programs in primary schools since 1999 and are currently teaching in over 750 schools across NSW.

The program is aligned to the area of social and emotional learning as part of the PDHPE curriculum. Children and young people who can understand and manage their feelings are more likely to develop a positive sense of self and be confident and curious learners.

This program will begin in Term 3, week 1. Each class will attend one lesson per week for the duration of 10 weeks. The cost of this program for the 10 sessions will be \$35.00, if you would like to pay this off over the term please contact the front office. This program is not compulsory and students not attending will be doing an alternate mindfulness activity. Thank you to all of the families who have paid for this program already.

School Attendance

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include being sick or having an infectious disease, having an unavoidable medical appointment, being required to attend a recognised religious holiday and exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

When your child misses just one day per fortnight this equals 4 weeks per year and over a year missed in their school life.

Arriving at school and class on time ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day, helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine, gives students time to greet their friends before class and reduces classroom disruptions. Lateness is recorded as a partial absence.

Next week is the last week of term for 2 weeks. Our students will return to school on Tuesday July 13.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

In 2021 all Australian Government schools will be implementing the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD), for school students with a disability.

This important data collection will reflect the support that is already being provided to students and will focus on the steps the school is taking to ensure that all students can access education on the same basis. The data will be used to inform future planning by governments and education authorities and will help us to better support the participation of students with disability in our school and all other NSW public schools.

The data collection will focus on the adjustments that are being made by teachers and schools to support individual students to access and participate in education. Schools will collect information already available in the school about:

- The level of adjustment being provided to support students with disability to participate in their schooling like all other students
- The number of students who receive each level of adjustment
- Where known, the student's type of disability.

The data collection process will have no direct impact on your child and they will not be involved in any testing process.

Reported data will be made available in such a way that the privacy all students is maintained.

If you do not want your child to be counted in the data collection you must complete the attached form and return it to the school before Friday 16 July.

Here are some samples of the wonderful artworks that were created from a variety of students grades K- 6.












Online Enrolment

We are excited to announce the roll out of the new Online Enrolment System. The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens,
- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from our front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Online Payments*

It is very easy for parents to make online payments to the school via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa, MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/ debit card details are captured in a secure manner; these details are not passed back to the school. The DoE preferred method for all money coming into the school is the Payment On-Line facility (POP) through the school's website: Kariong-p.school@det. nsw.edu.au

Item categories

 If a POP payment is made before 6pm, your payment will be processed on the next day's school statement. If it is made after 6pm, the school will be notified two days later.

Please ensure that on your child's permission note, you fill in the section for POP which will require the receipt number.

- At the bottom of every note that requires payment, there is a section for cash, cheque, and Payment On Line, for your convenience.
- Please do not make payments for uniforms on this site. The Uniform Shop is privately run and their website for ordering is: gtschool.com.au.

Helpful Hints

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' to cover items not covered in the previous headings, 'Other' can be used to make a complete payment of a school Statement of Account.

When you access the \$ Make a payment you must enter:

the student's name
date of birth

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

A REMINDER ABOUT ABOUT MONEY COLLECTING PROCEDURES

All cash money sent to the school is to be brought to the Administration Office and placed into the letterbox slot that is on the front wall near the counter. This will allow payments to be placed securely, even when the office is not open.

Please do not leave money on the counter. We ask that the envelope be marked with your child's name, class and what the payment is for, to allow the payment to be processed.

The office staff will administer all money and a receipt will be issued to the family, which will go to the student's class teacher to send home. This procedure ensures better handling of all monies and reduces disruption to teachers and students.

We provide a variety of ways to make payments within the school, to make it easier for families and alleviate some students bringing large amounts of money to school.

EFTPOS payments may be processed at the Administration Office between hours 8.30am - 3.00pm.

We no longer are permitted to take EFTPOS over the phone. For any enquiries regarding the online payment process, please contact Kariong School Administration Office.
