PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parent/Caregivers

As parents will be aware the operation of the school canteen and uniform shop has been taken over from the P&C by the school as from 1st November 2010. This followed considerable conflict within the P&C over the operation of the canteen and uniform shop over a considerable period of time which ended in the P&C being placed in recess. I want to stress that following the P&C being placed into recess an audit of the school uniform shop by a senior DET auditor found that no stock or money was unaccounted for. However the audit did make some very significant recommendations to tighten procedures in the uniform shop to ensure transparency. These changes which had been proposed earlier by the P&C Treasurer but not implemented, have all now been implemented.

I have been instructed to arrange for the position of canteen / uniform shop manager to be advertised by the end of the term and the advertisement appears on page 2. An abbreviated version of the advertisement will also run in the Express Advocate.

The selection panel will comprise of myself, as convenor, Mrs Helene Annabel (P&C fundraising coordinator) and Mr Kev Dumpleton (Central Coast Federation of P&Cs, Canteen Manager Wadalba Community School).

With the P&C in recess I took the decision to ask Mrs Annabel to be the parent representative because she is an active P&C member who has not been identified with either side of the issues around the canteen.

BAGS OF HOPE FOR CAMBODIAN CHILDREN

'Thousands of Cambodian children go to school every day without a bag in which to carry their most basic necessities (books, stationery, food and – vitally important – bottled drinking water to help them avoid contracting dysentery from unsafe drinking water).'

'Many NSW public school children acquire new backpacks or school bags for the new school year. This campaign is an opportunity for those children to leave their old bags (or new ones if they are that way inclined) at their schools in the last week of term, thereby making a huge difference to the lives and education of children in Cambodia. The bags will be packed with books and stationery and shipped to Cambodia, to be distributed around the country to needy school children, in time for the commencement of their school year in March 2011.'



The SRC and Ms Boland will be co-ordinating this project in the last week of term. So please think about it and if you are able to help send your old school bags to school to be collected in Week 10.

ENCOURAGING YOUR CHILD TO READ AT HOME

Be yourself and involve your child in everyday conversations from an early age.

Read aloud to your child. It will help your child to learn the language of books and encourage the enjoyment of books and reading.

Talk about books together - make reading a shared, enjoyable activity.

See that there is a range of reading material for your child at home, both fiction and non-fiction.

Read to your child in your first language - research shows that using your first language will help your child when he or she learns to read English.

Try not to let television intrude on reading time - set aside some uninterrupted time to read with your child.

Listen to your child read every day, even if only for a short time.

Give books as treats and presents.

Discuss the meanings of stories and words.


