Parent satisfaction survey

Recently we surveyed a cross-section of the Kariong Public School parent community, gauging parent satisfaction with various aspects of the school's performance. We sent out nearly 150 survey forms, of which 100 were returned. This represents about one quarter of our families. The results are shown in the table below.

When analysing the results, we want to do more than simply say that the overwhelmingly positive response indicates that there is nothing we can do better. Areas we will look at include student welfare and discipline, "challenging" programs, technology and school uniform. Your views will be sought on each of these areas next year.

STUDENT PRESENTATION ASSEMBLIES

Next week the remainder of our Student Presentation Assemblies will be held. Invitations have been handed out to the recipients of awards inviting their parents or caregivers to come and join us on the day. Parents will be seated in the COLA area for the Stage 2 and 3 Assemblies.

CLASSES FOR 2012

As is the normal pattern for our school a great deal happens over the school holidays much of which is unexpected. Your advice is crucial at the start of the new school year if your family circumstances change. All 2012 Year 1 – Year 6 students will return back to their current 2011 Class Teachers, if at all possible, or to a Support Staff member who knows the class for Holding Pattern. The class name retains the teacher's initial and the year is changed. For instance, Class 2E would become 3E and 5W would become 6W etc for Holding Pattern. Students during Holding Pattern will review class and school routines and we will do our utmost to get all children off to a settled return to school. We also will be settling new Years 1-6 students into KPS.

Our Kindergarten classes commence on Thursday, 2nd February. Once our Kindergarten numbers are realised we hope to move all other students (Years 1-6) as quickly as possible into their new classes with their new teachers. If, however, we do not realise our anticipated Kinder enrolments we will have to go back to the drawing board to reconfigure all our classes for 2012. This has a tremendous impact on staffing. We continue to seek your understanding in these circumstances.

LEVEL ONE REWARD

Congratulations to all the children who have remained on Level One of our welfare system throughout this term, which is the vast majority of children. We hope you enjoyed your reward today.

YEAR 6 STUDENTS' AUTOGRAPHS

A timely reminder that under child protection rights students cannot sign clothing that is being worn by another person. If you wish to collect autographs this week you must do so on a piece of clothing, soft toy or book that has been brought from home and is approved by the parent or caregiver to be signed. Also any unwanted, clean school clothing can be sent to the school for use in the clothing pool.

SPORT AND GROUP PHOTOS

Pre purchased Sport and group photos have been delivered to the school by the photographer. They have been handed out to the students. If you have not received your order please contact the office.

REPORTS

Students received their Semester 2 report today. Enjoy the opportunity to sit down with your child/children and go through their reports. Even the youngest child will be proud of their achievements and will love getting a pat on the back from mum and dad. If there are areas for development, be positive with your child about next year being a fresh start and that you are sure if they work hard things will improve.

STATIONERY PACKS

In 2012 student stationery packs will once again be available from the school to purchase. These provide students with the equipment that the teachers deem to be essential to complete class work. A note stating provisions in each pack and costs will be given early next year. Students in Years 3-6 have responsibility for the equipment they receive in the pack when they purchase it. In K-2 teachers assume responsibility for the organisation of the equipment.

As all items in the pack are consumables there is very little left by the end of the year, if at all. The pencils after a year of sharpening are usually only stubs which are kept in the classroom as spares. As the leftovers are minimal or not in suitable condition we do not send items home at the end of the school year. All students will take their workbooks home.
