










WRITING INSPIRED BY A TEXT



4C and 4N have been working on a literature study for the book 'The Thing About Oliver' by Deborah Kelly The Thing About Oliver is an appealing, although heart-wrenching, story for children told through the voice of twelve-year-old Tilly. Tilly dreams of becoming a marine scientist, but she doesn't even own a swimsuit. She lives in a drought-stricken town with her mum and younger brother Oliver, who has autism. Oliver's meltdowns are making life difficult and challenging.

The students in these classes were explicitly taught how to use tension building events to draw out important moments, Our writer of the week, Flora, was asked to write her narrative from Oliver's point of view using the tension building events that occurred.

Students discussed what Oliver might be thinking, feeling and doing during these tension building moments. Students were reminded how the tension can be drawn out, so that a reader is engaged and that tension events are not instantly resolved.

W! My head hurts so much. It's so early, but I wet the bed and I don't know how to tell mum. These clothes are itchy and so are my bed sheets. Mum knows I only like the cotton ones! I can't stand this, I'm so tired of them only hearing me scream, they wonder why I'm frustrated but I can't tell them why. The neighbours hate me, they filed a complaint. I want them to know what I'm actually saying. Tilly just woke up even she's tired of me. I can see her with her brown hair all over her face and dark circles under her brown eyes but she still gets up and makes me breakfast.

I go out and eat it while she gets my bed sheets and puts them in the washing machine. When she turns the washing machine on mum wakes up, even though she's really tired. She puts new bed sheets on my bed and asks me whether I am ready to go to speech therapy and OT?

I can't believe we've moved to Queensland

and we're living here with this Aunt Janine lady like I've only met her once. Yesterday a random lady walked in the house like she owned the place but it turns out to be mum. My little mind is gonna forget that and I'm gonna go frantic. Also I can't go outside because there are no fences plus the garbage truck isn't there and it's Monday.

I hate this place. I just realised that Aunt Janine and Tilly aren't here and mum's asleep so you know what i'm going to do, I'm going to go look out the big window that is in Tillys room. Ooh look at the big birdies in the tree.

I lay down on the floor with my legs under Tilly's bed. Oh what's that thing I'm kicking. Oh that's nice I'm gonna rip it now *crr*. Oh that sound is horrible but ripping paper is so fun so I'm gonna rip more stuff, *crrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrr. Oh no they're home I better run away. Tilly goes into her room and starts screaming, I never knew her screaming could irritate me, then she starts screaming at me then mum. Next thing, she runs away. I wish I could apologise to her when she comes back but I don't know how to talk and I don't know if she will come back.





Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Change and loss are issues all of us face at some stage of our lives. At Kariong Public School we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or related circumstances, young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. We are therefore offering a very successful education program called Seasons for Growth. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem solving, decision making, effective communication and support networks.

Seasons For Growth runs for 8 weeks in school hours and each weekly session is 40-45 minutes. The program concludes with a 'celebration' session. Later in the year each group will have the opportunity to meet for a further session to build on their earlier learning. There is no cost involved.

Seasons For Growth will commence Term 2 for Years 1-6. For children to benefit from the program, it is recommended that the change/ loss will have occurred at least 12 months ago. If you would like your child to participate, we would encourage you to talk to him/her about this, then fill in the form attached and return to the office by Wednesday 9th April. Please also include a brief reason for participation e.g. divorce, death etc. Students who have not participated in the program before will be given first preference.


