This year, the speech may be a topic of own choice or if your child would like to enter the 25th anniversary year of the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition, they must choose a topic from the list below. The Multicultural Public Speaking Competition is only for Stages 2 and 3 and will be run throughout New South Wales schools. Kariong Public School will be selecting 2 students from each **of these** stage**s** to enter the competition and compete against other schools in the district.

All students are expected to participate at their class level and class speeches will begin on Monday Week 3, Term 3. Students should choose a topic they are interested in so they are enthusiastic in the presentation and talk about hobbies, activities or issues that are important to them. Two students will be chosen from each class to present their Multicultural Perspectives speech at the grade finals to be held in the hall in Week 5. Unfortunately, due to restrictions, we will not be able to have parents/carers attend as an audience.

Two students from each stage will then be chosen to represent our school at the district finals which will be held later in the term. The exact date and location is still to be determined.

Multicultural Perspectives 2020 Topics:

Length of Speech:

- Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten) and Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2): 1 2 minutes
- Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4) and Stage 3 (Years 5 & 6): 3 4 minutes

Public Speaking Tips:

- Have an introduction this is your chance to grab the audience's attention.
- **Body of speech** should include interesting facts; make your points, using emotive language if you can.
- The **conclusion** should have a strong ending, not ending in 'Thank you' or 'Thank you for listening to my speech'.
- The audience needs to feel that the speaker's style is sincere and genuine.
- Visual and vocal expression a speaker's face and tone should be animated.
- Eye contact with the audience is vital, so notes should be kept to a minimum. You should use palm cards if using notes. (1/4 of an A4 page is suitable.)
- Keep to the time limit
