- Parents, carers and relatives may enter the school to drop off and pick up students • using the school's QR code. Signing in manually is also available.
- All visitors to our school site must comply with sign-in arrangements. Examples of • this are when you attend meetings or are volunteering at the school This includes the requirement to sign the school sign-in sheet where you acknowledge that you will comply with the COVID-19 requirements for visitors, contractors and service providers each time you visit. Visitors must also check in using the Service NSW QR code.
- P&C meetings and other gatherings of parents and/or community members for school events can proceed.
- Parents, carers and relatives are able to attend school sporting events and activities, • whether indoors or outdoors.
- There are no recommended limits on the number of performers in singing groups, including for in-class educational activities such as group repetition, chanting, recitation, or singing activities.
- Students are reminded to remain vigilant and practise physical distancing and hygiene measures to ensure the safety and wellbeing of students and staff are maintained.
- In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 Clinics.

• Our school promotes the need for good hygiene practices such as regularly washing hands, avoiding the sharing of drinks or food and coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded.
